# Working in Parliament

This parliamentary term has proven to be an especially busy one. One of my most important jobs is raising local issues and concerns with Government Ministers. If there is a particular issue of concern to you, please let me know.



## Council Tax

Millions of pounds of council tax benefit go unclaimed every year, leaving too many people paying council tax when they should not. In the long term, I want to see council tax scrapped and replaced with a fairer system, which is

based on the ability to pay. In the meantime though, it is vital that more people, especially pensioners are told of the extra help available. That is why I am co-sponsoring a parliamentary Bill, which would require local councils to write to pensioners about claiming council tax benefit.

## Protecting the Environment

The UK has pledged to cut carbon dioxide emissions dramatically by 2010. However, Friends of the Earth say the Government is way off meeting these targets.

I believe the Government must do more to protect the environment and tackle climate change. This is one of the most important issues

facing this country and the world and one I will continue to campaign on, both in and out of Parliament.



## The Tsunami Disaster

I am sure you were as shocked as I was by the horrifying effects of the earthquake and tsunami



in Asia. As a member of the House of Commons International Development Committee, I have witnessed the poverty faced by many of the affected countries, even before the wave hit. I questioned Government Ministers on the UK's response to the disaster as soon as the House of Commons returned from the Christmas recess. Specifically, I have challenged the Chancellor to channel all the tax he gets from people's donations back into the UK's aid contribution.

## Fair Deal for Pensioners

Answers to my parliamentary questions have shown that hundreds of thousands of pensioners in Scotland are living below the poverty line. This prompted me to seek and secure a special parliamentary debate, specifically on the issue of pensioner poverty in West Edinburgh. I challenged the Pensions Minister on many of the issues, such as the poor state pension, their complicated and degrading mass means testing, local post office closures and the anger many older people have felt from the scrapping of pension books.

I am very grateful to the thousands of local people, who have now added their names in support

of my campaign for a substantial increase in the state pension. I will not let up on this Government until our pensioners get a fair deal.



## Police, not Plastic

I have strongly opposed the Government's plans to introduce compulsory identity cards. This scheme is likely to become another expensive Government IT failure because it relies on untested new technology. It is also unlikely to achieve its stated objectives of tackling illegal immigration, terrorism and fraud. Worst of all, the cost is likely to be in excess of

£3bn and there has been no proper analysis of its cost-effectiveness.

Many people are unaware of these compulsory ID cards, with each person having to pay as much as £85. I believe the savings from scrapping this ID card scheme should better spent on more police on the streets and better intelligence services. This would be a far more effective way of tackling crime.

## Save the Scottish Regiments

I was proud to be one of the thousands who marched in protest against the Government plans to amalgamate the Scottish regiments. I have also raised people's anger on this issue directly with the Defence Secretary in Parliament. There may very well be a case for reform in the army. However, to consider any reduction at a time when our armed forces are so needed and overstretched is nothing short of madness.



## Tackling local problems, helping local groups

Over the last few months, I have:

- ✓ campaigned vigorously against the closure of Strachan Road, Clermiston, Comely Bank, East Craigs and South Gyle post offices;
- ✓ inspected the Forth Rail Bridge to ensure this internationally recognized Scottish monument is properly maintained;
- ✓ attended remembrance ceremonies at Davidson's Mains and Corstorphine.
- ✓ met with the management of Job Centre Plus about proposed changes to local Job Centre and social security offices. I will not accept any changes that will result in a poorer service;
- ✓ pressed the Chancellor to drop his plans to change the rules on gift aid that could cost Edinburgh Zoo up to £500,000 a year;
- ✓ helped local scouts and charities by providing my constituency office as a drop off point for Scout Post;
- ✓ led the parliamentary campaign to keep the Royal Highland Centre at Ingliston;
- ✓ worked with local groups, like the Corstorphine Fair, on the rocketing costs of public liability insurance;
- ✓ supported local charities, such as the popular Loony Dook at South Queensferry on New Year's Day.
